

Release Form, Elementary Gym and Usage Rules for practices at: Floyds Knobs, Greenville, Georgetown, Highland Hills, and Floyd Central

- No child is to be dropped off without parents checking in to see if there is adult supervision.
- Nobody is allowed in the practice gyms except players and coaches because of background check requirements. Except to drop off or pickup before and after practice.
- · No drinks or food are allowed at any time in the gym.
- No child is to be outside of the gym without adult supervision.
- Children found outside the gym without adult supervision could result in suspension of current and future gym usage. This is inside and outside the school building.
- Any acts of vandalism occurring during scheduled times could result in the discontinuation of present and future building use privileges.
- A parent or responsible adult must accompany siblings of children participating in activities in the gym.
- School related activities take precedence over all other gym-scheduled uses. The school will
 attempt to notify persons renting gyms of any cancellations that could affect the renter's
 schedule.
- NAFCS students will be given priority usage over students from other schools outside the county.
- All gym schedules, building use activities, coaches, and students participating must be approved by the building administrator.
- Changes in schedule for gym usage remain the responsibility of persons scheduling the activity and they must notify all participants of changes.
- Persons responsible for the building rental usage are also responsible for contacting their participants of any cancellations or changes in scheduling.
- If coaches need to make changes in pre-arranged usage or participants, they must notify the school at least a week in advance. Failure to do so could result in suspension of further gym privileges.
- Nobody is allowed to bring their own basketballs to the games at Floyd Central and HHMS (players included). Only the coaches basketballs are to be used.
- No one is to sit on the top of the bleachers when pushed in. Failure to keep people off the top of
 the bleachers may result in the forfeiture of gym usage (especially at HHMS and Floyds Knobs
 Elementary).





Academy Day and Nomination FAQs

- Q: When is Academy Day?
- **A:** Academy Day is Saturday, September 10, 2022. Registration starts at 9:30 am and the program starts at 10:00 am.
- **Q:** Where is Academy Day?
 - A: Academy Day will be held at Seymour High School in the Auditorium Lobby.
- Q: Who can come to Academy Day?
- **A:** Academy Day is for all middle school and high school students interested in attending a U.S. Service Academy and is open to these students and their parents.
- Q: Is Academy Day attendance required to be considered for a nomination?
 - A: No, Academy Day is purely informational.
- Q: Do I have to live in the 9th district to attend?
 - A: No, but you must live in the 9th to apply for a nomination with our office.
- **Q:** Where can I find an application for a nomination?
 - **A:** By visiting our website, Hollingsworth.house.gov/serviceacademy.
- **Q:** When are applications for a nomination due?
- A: All nomination applications are to be submitted no later than Saturday, September 17.
- **Q:** Where do I submit my application?
- **A:** Completed applications are to be submitted by email to ServiceAcademyCoordinatorIN09@mail.house.gov.
- **Q:** When will interviews be held?
- **A:** Interviews will be held Saturday, October 1, 2022. You will be notified of your interview time 2 weeks in advance.
- **Q:** Is my application complete?
- **A:** Your application is complete when all required materials have been submitted including SAT/ACT scores. When our office receives your completed application, you will receive a confirmation email.
