- **5.** Create your new FinalForms password. Next, click CONFIRM ACCOUNT.
- 6. Click REGISTER STUDENT for your first child.

6. Complete each form and sign your full name (*i.e. 'Jonathan Smith'*) in the parent signature field on each page. After signing each, click SUBMIT FORM and move on to the next form.

7. When all forms are complete, you will see a 'Forms Finished' message.

IMPORTANT: If required by your district, an email will automatically be sent to the email address that you provided for your student that will prompt your student to sign required forms.

How do I register additional students?

How do I update information?



The Penguin Swim Team, member of the Kentucky–Indiana YMCA Swim Association (KIYSA), is a youth competitive swim team.

Participants ages 4-18 will have the opportunity to build competitive swimming skills, learn the rules of competitive swimming and increase swimming endurance. Participants will practice two or three times a week. Competitions include five dual or tri-meets and a championship meet for the full season. 


